## 1999 Call for Papers

June 1, 1999, is the deadline for the submission of proposals for sessions and papers for the 1999 annual meeting of the Southern Demographic Association. The meeting will be held October 28 through October 30 at the Menger Hotel in San Antonio, Texas. Applied and basic topics in demography are desirable, as are related topics in economics, sociology, geography, political science, and psychology. Works-in-progress are welcome. Individuals are encouraged to organize sessions, roundtables, software demonstrations, panel discussions, and workshops. Students are encouraged to submit papers.

Special honors for the best student papers and the best applied demography paper will be presented at the meeting. To be considered for the Student Paper Awards or the Walt Terrie Award for applied demography, applicants must indicate the award in which they are interested, submit their abstract by the June 1 deadline, and submit their completed paper by August 13. ## Call For Papers To Be Considered For Awards

The Southern Demographic Association gives awards for following types of papers at its annual meeting:

### ***OUTSTANDING GRADUATE STUDENT PAPER AWARD***

An award is given to the best graduate student paper delivered at the SDA meeting. The student selected for this award receives a cash prize and a certificate both of which are presented at the business meeting.

### ***OUTSTANDING UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT PAPER AWARD***

The SDA also awards a cash prize and certificate for the undergraduate paper presented at the annual meeting that is judged to be best.

To be considered for either the Graduate or Undergraduate award, papers should be sent to Program Chair Judith Waldrop by August 13.

### ***E. WALTER TERRIE AWARD FOR STATE AND LOCAL DEMOGRAPHY***

The SDA Board of Directors has approved the establishment of an award in memory of Dr. E. Walter Terrie. The award consists of a cash prize and a certificate for the best paper on an applied topic, especially one relating to state and local demography, presented at the annual meeting of the SDA. 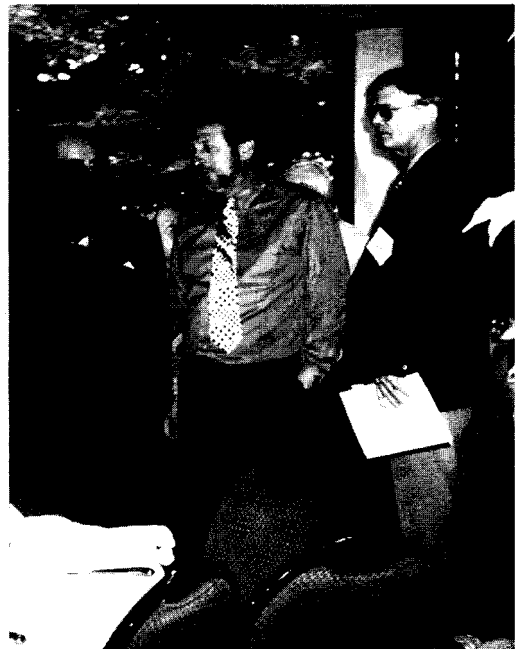

## Summer Research Opportunities in Demography for Undergraduates

---

**T**he Population Research Center at the University of Texas-Austin will be hosting its annual Research Experience for Undergraduates (REU) program in Minority Group Demography in the summer of 1999. This ten-week program offers undergraduates with junior or senior standing the opportunity to study demography through course work on demographic methods and a research apprenticeship with a PRC faculty affiliate. The program provides travel funds, tuition and books, room and board for the 10 week period, and a \$2000 stipend. Students will register for a 3-hour summer course in Analytical Demography during the first half of the summer, then dedicate the second half of the summer to their own projects in collaboration with a faculty mentor. Student projects will be presented at the fall meetings of the Southern Demographic Association.
